Achieve3000 National Lexile Study

Implementation and Impact

Research by Achieve3000 consistently demonstrates higher Lexile gains for students who have an average first try score of 75% or higher and complete at least 1 if not 2 or more multiple-choice activities per week (resulting in 40+ to 80+ on average over the school year). Students using the program with high or highest fidelity exceeded their expected Lexile growth by 2.5x and 3.5x. See graph (left) with results from the 2018-2019 National Lexile Study.






Implementation Categories

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Category Name	Definition	Instructional Recommendations
	Average First Try Score: 65% or Higher Activities: On track to complete 40 activities per year (1+ per week)	Identify a school (School-Level Detail page) and teacher where students have high quality and high quantity. Review what is being done in these classes and replicate/model for other teachers. To increase student collaboration in the classroom, consider Doug Fisher's Read-Discuss-Read implementations. This framework focuses on repeated reading and collaborative conversations, both proven to accelerate comprehension. Contact your Customer Success Advocate for more information.
High Quality, Low Quantity	Average First Try Score: 65% or Higher Activities: Not on track to complete 40 activities per year (1+ per week)	Look for ways to increase student time on task. Consider: - Reviewing available courses for additional lessons - Having students search for topics of interest - Encouraging at-home and afterschool use
Low Quality, High Quantity	Average First Try Score: Less than 65% Activities: On track to complete 40 activities per year (1+ per week)	Establish a close-reading protocol and model for students how to slow down their reading with the goal of improving activity scores. Also consider implementing Doug Fisher's Read-Discuss-Read framework. See above for details. Encourage students to use the First-Try Tracking Tool.
Low Quality, Low Quantity	Average First Try Score: Less than 65% Activities: Not on track to complete 40 activities per year (1+ per week)	Both quality and quantity should be addressed. With students, establish and model a close-reading protocol to slow down their reading and improve their scores. At the same time, work with other teachers and parents to increase the number of activities completed. Encourage students to search for lessons to complete.





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


Expected and Actual Lexile Growth: Grade Level





Expected and Actual Lexile Growth: Grade Level


