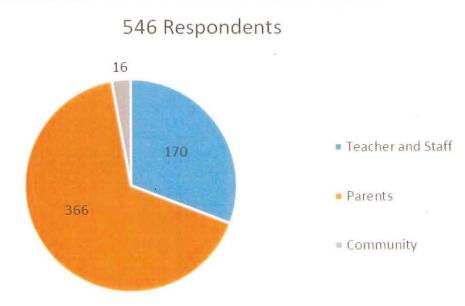


Unallowable Expenditures:

- Meals, refreshments, or snacks;
- End of the year celebrations, parties, or socials;
- Out of state travel or overnight field trips;
- Incentives, gift cards, or decorations;
- Advertisements or promotional materials;
- Purchase of facilities or vehicles, kitchen appliances, or furniture;
- Tuition, dues to organizations, clothing or uniforms

Grant expenditures submitted for approval were based on:

- Stakeholder Survey Results
- Input from Administrators
- Input from District Departments



Additional Staff to Support Students:

- MTSS Coordinator at EVERY Elementary, Middle, & K-8 school (\$2.6M)
- One (1) additional paraprofessional allocation at EVERY Elementary, Middle, & K-8 school (\$1.28M)
- Reading Coach at EVERY High School & 1 District Math Coach (\$941,000)
- Three (3) Staffing Specialists for ESE (\$500,000)
- One (1) Behavior Analyst (\$166,000)



Technology:

- 1:1 Devices (\$7.65 M)
- Data analytics program to replace Performance Matters with an upgraded, user friendly platform (\$288,000)
- Upgrade the single sign-on program to enable all student devices to access school content (\$228,000)
- Audio amplification and camera systems for classrooms district-wide (\$4.3 M)



Other Instructional Expenditures:

- Provide paid behavior training for paraprofessionals who serve students with disabilities (\$82,000)
- Purchase textbooks & instructional materials for grades
 K-12 that are aligned with the new BEST standards
 (\$3.5 M)
- Funding for summer school and extended school day and extended school year programs (\$460,000)



Other Instructional Expenditures:

- Additional duty pay for teachers to participate in after school instructional planning sessions (\$183,000)
- Funds to provide transportation services for students experiencing homelessness so they can continue to attend school without interruption (\$250,000)
- Communication devices and service plans for students experiencing homelessness (\$62,400)



Other Instructional Expenditures:

- Transportation for students to participate in after school, extended learning (\$166,000)
- Contracted virtual tutoring services for grades 5-12 (\$1.2M)



Other Allowable Expenditures:

- HVAC replacements and renovations (\$14.1 M)
- Air purification systems on school busses (\$350,000)
- Air filtration systems to improve indoor air quality in buildings (\$1.5 M)
- One time additional pay for instructional staff to retain highly qualified, veteran teachers (\$1.1 M)
- Set aside for additional bonus to employees in the event that the Governor does another round of premium pay (\$2.5 M)
